While the most essential meeting is our spring Comprehensive Needs Assessment and School Improvement Planning meeting each year, follow up is provided through committees, surveys, and other opportunities for participation and input.

In 2013, as part of an extended Strategic Planning Process, a community day long meeting was held with an outside facilitator from the Michigan Association of School Boards. As a result of this experience, district wide committees have formed with a wide range of stakeholders. An annual review of progress is conducted and presented to the community.

In 2014-2015 we planned for upcoming on site reviews from NCA. In preparation for this process, we were able to conduct and review stakeholder surveys using the tools provided by NCA. This provided valuable follow up on the strategic planning survey and will provide growth data as we continue to gather stakeholder input.

As part of the Comprehensive Needs Assessment, a survey of stakeholders (students, parents and teachers) was conducted and used to determine school and district improvement priorities.
